From the Grand Exalted Ruler: Spring has spring, summer coming fast



Hey, hey it is the first of May. I hope you were able to turn in your Community Project Contest form to get your Lodge some deserved recognition. Remember, the annual charity report is due May 1.

The first week of May is also Elks National Youth Week. I would encourage you to hold an

event and honor all those who participated in your Lodge's youth programs over the past year. A variety of participation certificates available online. However, if you cannot find one, make one up. Show our youth that Elks are there for them.

Further, sponsor programs that encourage youth to become outstanding citizens. If so, we will help them with "Meeting the Challenge."

Three honorable events take place this month. While only one is mandatory for Elks, the other two need to be recognized as well.

Sunday, May 8 is Mother's Day. This is a mandatory service that needs to be performed by your Lodge. This event is open to the public and extra attention should be taken to ensure this ceremony is well attended to show the respect all moms deserve. The Special Ritual Manual also requires the use of red and white carnations to honor these mothers. Please perform this service and show that Elks Care — Elks Share for moms everywhere.

The second event is Armed Services Day held on Saturday, May 21. In 1949, Defense Secretary Louis Johnson presented an idea to create one single day to celebrate the unification of the armed forces under the Department of Defense, instead of celebrating each separately. Schedule an event to honor all active armed services members. Invite them to the Lodge, provide them a meal, and show our support for all they do for us and our country.

Then comes Memorial Day, held on Monday, May 30. This day is for honoring the men and women who have given the

ultimate sacrifice for our country while in the United States military. In the years following the Civil War, it was originally known as Decoration Day. By the late 1860s, Americans in towns and cities started holding springtime tributes to the countless fallen soldiers from this conflict by decorating their graves with flowers and reciting prayers. It became an official federal holiday in 1971.

We now not only honor our fallen United States service men and women, but also family members who have passed on. We hold family gatherings and parades to unofficially mark the beginning of summer.

The Grand Exalted Ruler was given a tour of the historic Astoria Lodge on Thursday morning as well as a visit to the Astoria Column before heading back to seaside for meetings and the evening VIP banquet. In addition to Grand Exalted Ruler Mills we were also joined by Grand Trustee Joe Basil and his wife Virginia, State Sponsor and Past Grand Exalted Ruler Roger True, and several guests from Washington and Idaho.



Friday kicked off with various workshops and committee meetings where members could learn the latest from the various OSEA Committee chairs. These sessions were

Friday afternoon the session as officially opened by President Rick Shipley and after the introduction of dignitaries and roll call, delegates began voting on bylaws changes and the new OSEA officers. We were also treated to an unforgettable address from Grand Exalted Ruler Mills in which he gave a humorous but impactful narrative of the initiation ritual from the perspective of a new member and the importance of lodge officers conducting an impressive and meaningful ritual. And while many have asked, there was no recording made of the session to share with those who could not attend. The session concluded with the installation of the 2022-2023 OSEA officers and presentation of gifts for both GER Mills and Amy as well as outgoing President Rick Shipley and Chairman of the Board Gary Miller. The day, and the convention, wound down with the Presidents Reception in honor of our new OSEA State President Ben Adams and his wife Joedy. 

This is a \$12,000 investment that will return at least two times (with the potential for more) that much in airtime value.

In addition to group tickets we will also have a community information table on the concourse during the game to hand out information about the Elks and what we do to those in attendance. This will be a great chance to promote the Elks, share what we do, and have a great night out while sharing our pride in the Elks.

We are continuing to update the content of our state website and further utilize social media. We are also looking into ways to take donations to our state major project and other charitable projects.

Finally, we will be launching a new mobile app in June with several test lodges in Oregon to help engage members, increase communication, and more. This app will be available to all Elks and more information will be coming in future newsletters and on our website and social media.

Hoop Shoot National Finalists



The Elks Hoop Shoot National Finals were held April 30th in Chicago, Illinois. This year marks the 50th anniversary of this program which started right here in Oregon at the Corvallis Lodge with Past Grand Exalted Ruler Frank Hise. This year, Oregon was represented by two outstanding young ladies at the national finals.

First, representing the Seaside Elks Lodge is Jahzara Marshall (10-11 girls) who we were introduced to at the Summer Convention. At the regional contest she shot 18 for 25 and at the national finals shot 16 out of 25.

Second, representing the birthplace of the Hoop Shoot is Kinsey Wark (12-13 girls) from the Corvallis Elks Lodge. Kinsey shot 20 out of 25 at the regional contest and repeated that with 20 out 25 at the national finals.

These two students excelled through local lodge, district, state, and the regional competition to earn their spot in the national finals. Unfortunately, neither girl earned a medal, but we are extremely proud of our two national finalists!

Betty Hise for Cancer Research



Betty Hise for Cancer Research held our luncheon in Seaside at the Summer Convention. Almost every seat was filled for our event that featured a fun spring

theme, and speaker Lisa Nolen, Associate Director of Community Involvement, OHSU Foundation.

Because of the generosity of Betty Hise for Cancer Research funds, OHSU purchased a bioimpedance machine to support baseline testing, surveillance, and early intervention for the treatment of lymphedema.

What is lymphedema? Lymph nodes are small structures that circulate and filter fluid as part of the immune system. They may be removed in cancer surgery or damaged by radiation therapy or certain types of chemotherapy drugs. Lymphedema is the fluid buildup in the limbs, causing swelling, pain and a heaviness in the affected arm or leg.

OHSU is continuing to develop an impressive program. They were granted in 2020 the highest level of designation by the Center of Excellence for Lymphedema; an honor granted to only 15 institutions worldwide. OHSU has an interdisciplinary program combining expertise from oncology, rehabilitation therapy, infectious disease, endocrinology, nutrition, surgical oncology and plastic surgery to treat the whole patient at risk for this complex disease.

Betty Hise for Cancer Research is proud to support OHSU of Portland along with supporting St. Luke's Cancer Institute in Idaho. Idaho's Elks Summer Convention will be held in Coeur d' Alene Idaho June 2-4, 2022. Betty Hise Idaho Co-Chairs Alicia Neely and Judy Gessford are planning a live auction after their Friday banquet and silent auction throughout their convention to close at the end of Saturday session.

Betty Hise for Cancer Research is pleased to report while at the Oregon Elks Summer Convention, we took in funds totaling \$29,227.35. Thank you to Lodges and individuals for your monetary donations and silent auction items contributed!! We couldn't do what we are able to do without you! As always we thank you for your interest and support.
